Academic Events

Lecture on “Understanding Rights, Remedies, and Commercial Realities for MSMEs in India,” delivered by Mr. Pranshu Kaushal, Advocate, Supreme Court of India



A guest lecture on the topic “Understanding Rights, Remedies, and Commercial Realities for MSMEs in India” was conducted for B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) students on July 31, 2025, as part of the university’s ongoing initiative to integrate practical exposure into legal education. The lecture was delivered by Mr. Pranshu Kaushal, a distinguished legal professional currently practicing as an Advocate at the Supreme Court of India, as well as before various courts and tribunals in the State of Uttar Pradesh.

During the session, Mr. Kaushal provided students with a comprehensive overview of the Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector from a legal standpoint. Emphasizing the significance of the MSMED Act, 2006, the lecture moved beyond mere classification of enterprises to focus on core legal and commercial challenges faced by MSMEs in India. These included issues like delayed payments from buyers, breach of contractual obligations, and the limited capacity of MSMEs to access and afford prolonged litigation.





The University collaborated with the National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU), Agartala Campus, to successfully conduct a single-credit course titled “Forensic Evidence and the Indian Criminal Justice System” for B.A.LL.B. students of Semester V. This initiative aimed to provide interdisciplinary knowledge that links forensic science with legal education.

The course, which took place from August 04–19, 2025, included essential modules such as Introduction to Forensic Science and Criminal Law; Collection, Preservation, and Analysis of Forensic Evidence; the Role and Admissibility of Forensic Evidence in Indian Courts and Criminal Trials; as well as Emerging Trends and Challenges in Forensic Science.

Renowned instructors like Dr. H.K. Pratihari, Director, NFSU, Dr. Jyoti Roy Choudhuri, Assistant Professor), and other experts from the NFSU Agartala Campus facilitated the sessions, ensuring high academic standards and relevance to contemporary issues. In conjunction with this academic initiative, the students also toured the Tripura State Forensic Science Laboratory on August 26, 2025. This program offered participants valuable perspectives on both the scientific and legal aspects of justice, establishing a benchmark for collaborative academic undertakings at NFSU Agartala.





The University welcomed its 3rd cohort of B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) and LL.M. students during a two-day Induction and Orientation Programme held on August 11–12, 2025, marking another milestone in its mission to offer top-tier legal education in the state.

The inaugural session was graced by the presence of the Hon'ble Mr. Justice M.S. Ramachandra Rao, Chief Justice of the High Court of Tripura and Chancellor, who presided over the ceremony; Prof. (Dr.) N.L. Mitra, the Founding Vice-Chancellor of NLU Jodhpur and a former Director of NLSIU Bangalore, who was the Chief Guest; and Shri Ratan Datta, Chairman of the Bar Council of Tripura, who was the Guest of Honour.

Chief Justice Rao praised the University's leadership and faculty for successfully achieving full enrollment in both programmes, commending the Vice-Chancellor's vibrant vision and commitment to advancing NLU Tripura toward excellence. The Hon'ble Chief Justice reassured both parents and students that the University is dedicated to providing best infrastructure and top-notch facilities, while also emphasizing that efforts are underway to hasten the completion of its permanent campus.

Prof. N.L. Mitra, leveraging his extensive experience in legal education, highlighted that law influences all dimensions of life—including governance, business, technology, the environment, human rights, and international relations. He remarked that the legal profession symbolizes both a calling and a responsibility, representing “an army of human rights” for the common man. Shri Ratan Datta warmly welcomed the new cohort, extending congratulations for their enrollment in one of the region's most promising law schools.

In his welcoming speech, Founding Vice-Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Yogesh Pratap Singh reflected on the evolution of National Law Universities and encouraged students to be the torchbearers of NLU Tripura's future. The session concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by the Registrar, Prof. (Dr.) Nachiketa Mittal.

The second day focused on orienting students to the university's academic and extracurricular activities. It featured a health check-up camp, a session on “Benefits of Yoga for Mental Health” presented by Dr. Sanjib Kr. Bhowmik, and an Anti-Ragging skit highlighting the zero-tolerance policy toward ragging. The two-day event was designed to facilitate a seamless academic transition and motivate students for their journey at NLU Tripura.



National Law University, Tripura, conducted an expert session titled “Learning the Law with AI” on August 21, 2025. The speaker for the event was Dr. Praveen Tripathi, who serves as the Registrar and Associate Professor at Dharmashastra National Law University in Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh. Both LL.M. and undergraduate students from the University attended the session.

Dr. Tripathi commenced his presentation by introducing the attendees to the changing landscape of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in the realm of legal education and practice. He discussed various types of AI models that are currently in use, focusing particularly on Retrieval-Augmented Generation (RAG) applications, which integrate large language models with verified data sources to enhance accuracy and reliability.

A significant highlight of the session was his in-depth, hands-on demonstration of NotebookLM, a state-of-the-art AI platform. The students were walked through the practical applications of this tool for research, summarization, and information retrieval. Dr. Tripathi emphasized that while such AI-driven platforms can substantially improve learning and research efficiency, their application requires careful examination to avoid hallucinations (false or fabricated outputs), a common drawback of generative AI systems.

He warned students against excessive dependence on generative AI models for academic or legal tasks, stressing that AI should be regarded as a supportive resource rather than a replacement for human judgment. In his view, the true benefit of AI lies in its ability to help students and legal professionals save time, refine research, and access organized information—while maintaining the critical thinking, reasoning, and analytical skills that are fundamental to the field of law.

The interactive session prompted students to think about the ethical and intellectual aspects of technology in legal education. Dr. Tripathi highlighted that integrating technology into the legal sector is unavoidable, but it must be approached with responsibility, discernment, and a commitment to academic integrity.

Dr. Tripathi’s insights provided students with a well-rounded viewpoint—recognizing the vast potential of AI while reaffirming the essential role of human reasoning and legal expertise. The session was organized by Dr. Jayanta Dhar, Assistant Professor at NLU Tripura, along with Mr. Nehru, a full-time Ph.D. scholar.



National Law University, Tripura, hosted an expert session themed “Research Begins with a Question: Crafting the Right Dissertation Topic” on August 22, 2025, in the LL.M. Classroom at the New Campus. Dr. Praveen Tripathi, the Registrar and Associate Professor at Dharmashastra National Law University in Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh, served as the resource person for the session. The event saw enthusiastic engagement from both LL.M. and undergraduate students of the University.

Dr. Praveen Tripathi began his talk by stressing that every significant research effort starts with a well-defined question. He explained how to identify and refine a research topic, starting from a broad personal academic interest and gradually narrowing it down to a specific and researchable issue.

In his presentation, Dr. Praveen Tripathi pointed out several crucial factors that a researcher must think about when formulating a dissertation topic. He highlighted the necessity of starting with a broad subject area before moving on to define the major concepts within it. From this point, the topic should be progressively narrowed by considering whether it should be limited to a particular geographical region or a specific time frame. Additionally, he emphasized the importance of clearly defining core concepts and terms to enhance analytical clarity. A well-crafted research topic should also suggest the methodology to be used for examining the relevant data and reflect the overarching goal or purpose of the research.

To provide practical insights, Dr. Praveen Tripathi involved the students in an interactive exercise. He instructed them to first select their preferred subject area in law, then dissect it into core concepts, and finally, using the guiding questions he presented, refine these into specific, researchable dissertation topics. This activity allowed the students to critically evaluate their academic interests and transform them into feasible research questions.

The session proved to be extremely useful for both postgraduate and undergraduate students, as it clarified the essential first step in academic research—formulating the appropriate question. It also inspired participants to engage in research with analytical precision and methodological clarity. The session was coordinated by Dr. Jayanta Dhar, Assistant Professor at NLU Tripura, and Mr. Nehru, a full-time Ph.D. scholar.

4th Tripura Dialogue Forum Talk on “Policing in North-Eastern Regions: Challenges and the Way Forward” delivered by Shri Anurag, IPS, Director General of Police, Government of Tripura



The 4th Tripura Dialogue Forum Talk was organized on August 28, 2025, by National Law University, Tripura, focusing on the theme “Policing in North Eastern Regions: Challenges and the Way Forward.” The event featured Shri Anurag, IPS, Director General of Police, Government of Tripura, as the eminent speaker, offering insights into law enforcement dynamics in the region.

The session was supported by Prof. (Dr.) Yogesh Pratap Singh, Vice-Chancellor, as the patron, and Dr. Debasree Debnath, Assistant Professor of Law, as the faculty advisor. The program took place at the TJA Auditorium. The talk aimed to foster dialogue on regional policing challenges and strategic solutions.





On September 08, 2025, the Pro Bono Club and Legal Aid Society of National Law University, Tripura, held their flagship event, “Nyaya Sangam 1.0 – A Conclave on Legal Aid and Pro Bono Service.”

The Hon’ble Dr. T. Justice Amarnath Goud, Judge, High Court of Tripura & Chairman of the Tripura State Legal Services Authority, inaugurated the event with inspiring remarks. The conclave featured a panel discussion with distinguished speakers, including Prof. S.K. Gupta from Banaras Hindu University; Mr. Prasun De, Director of Panchayats, Government of Tripura; Mr. Amarjit Dey, Secretary of DLSA, West Tripura; and Mr. Rajib Paul, an experienced paralegal volunteer.

Faculty and student members from the Legal Aid Societies and Pro Bono Clubs of various law schools in West Tripura, such as Tripura Government Law College, ICAFI University Tripura Law School, and Techno India University Tripura Law School, also participated.

The panel deliberated on how law student committees could collaborate more effectively. They explored avenues for cooperation within the state and with other universities, as well as strengthening ties with Legal Aid Societies and Pro Bono agencies. The discussion also covered methods to enhance the socio-legal responsibilities of student committees. Prof. (Dr.) Yogesh Pratap Singh, Vice-Chancellor of NLU Tripura, suggested that student committees could collaborate with the Department of Panchayats in Tripura, proposing a novel approach to institutional cooperation.





National Law University, Tripura, successfully hosted a special lecture on “Jurisprudence and Legal Theory: A Philosophical Study of Law” from September 08–10, 2025, on its campus. This event was carefully designed to enhance critical engagement with the evolution and intricate nature of legal thought, emphasizing both classical foundations and contemporary interpretations across various schools of jurisprudence.


It provided a valuable platform for fostering intellectual discourse, enriching the academic environment, and expanding the horizons of emerging legal professionals at NLU Tripura.

The Centre for Intellectual Property Studies (CIPS) at National Law University, Tripura, successfully hosted an insightful online lecture on October 10, 2025, titled “Digital Marketplace Challenges: Reconciling Trademark Protection with Consumer Interests.”

We were honored to welcome Mr. Abhinav Mohan Goel, Advocate, Supreme Court of India and High Court of Himachal Pradesh, as the speaker. Mr. Goel masterfully unpacked the complex dynamics of trademark protection in today’s digital marketplaces.

The session offered crucial perspectives on how to balance brand rights with consumer interests, tackling urgent issues like the pervasive spread of counterfeit goods, the threat of cybersquatting, and general brand misuse across emerging online platforms. Participants gained significant clarity and practical insights, enhancing their understanding of these rapidly evolving challenges and the future trajectory of trademark regulation in the digital era. It was a fantastic opportunity to grapple with concepts at the intersection of law, technology, and commerce.





On October 28, 2025, the Kautilya Society at National Law University, Tripura (NLUT), successfully organized an impactful online podcast discussion titled “Tripura’s Construction Workers: A Fight for Health.” This significant event brought together students, faculty, and legal enthusiasts to address the pressing issues of occupational health and safety faced by the construction workers who form the backbone of the state’s infrastructure development.

The session was inaugurated by the Hon’ble Vice-Chancellor of NLUT, Prof. (Dr.) Yogesh Pratap Singh, who emphasized the vital importance of integrating social realities into legal education. He stressed that academic institutions must look beyond theoretical instruction and actively engage with ground-level concerns affecting vulnerable communities, setting a socially relevant tone for the discussion on labour rights and worker protection.

The insightful podcast featured Shri Biswajit Paul, TCS (SSG), the Labour Commissioner of Tripura, and was hosted by Krishna Bisht, a 2nd year B.A.LL.B. student and member of the Kautilya Society. Shri Paul provided a detailed and practical overview, highlighting the initiatives undertaken by the Tripura Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare (TBOCWW) Board. Key initiatives include:

- **Nirman Shramik Welfare Scheme 2.0:** He elaborated on the simplification of the registration process and the positive impact of extensive awareness drives.
- **Health and Safety:** Welfare measures now include provisions for occupational injury treatment, respiratory disease prevention, and dermatological care, recognizing the increased importance of these measures in light of climate change.
- **Compliance and Access:** Regular awareness camps are organized, offering monetary benefits of up to ₹25,000. Migrant workers are being integrated into the official network through registration under the e-Shram portal. Inspections are routinely conducted under Section 39 of the BOCW Act, 1996, and protective gear is distributed. Furthermore, workers can self-register through the online portal under Rules 178 and 179 of the Tripura BOCW Rules, 2001. Violations of safety regulations invite penalties under Sections 47 to 50 of the Act.

The event, which concluded with a vote of thanks by Faculty Advisor Ms. Susmita Das, successfully deepened the understanding of labour law in practice and reaffirmed NLUT’s institutional vision of bridging legal academia with meaningful social transformation.



The Centre for Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) at National Law University, Tripura, was acknowledged and awarded at the esteemed event “SAMMAN – Honouring the Pathbreakers of Mediation,” hosted by the Association for India International Mediation and Arbitration Services (AIIMAS) in New Delhi on November 05, 2025, celebrating the 5th anniversary of AIIMAS.

This recognition highlights the Centre’s pivotal role in advancing mediation and various Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) methods in the northeastern part of India. In the last two years, the Centre for ADR at NLU Tripura has developed into a dynamic centre for research, training, and awareness regarding consensual dispute resolution.

During the event, AIIMAS granted a special acknowledgment to the Research Centre on Alternative Dispute Resolution established at NLU Tripura for its consistent growth and leadership in nurturing a culture of mediation and arbitration for legal practitioners, students, and community members in the region. The Research Centre at NLU Tripura aims to extend mediation services to village panchayats in Tripura in collaboration with the Department of Panchayats. This customized program, designed for rural communities, will be supported by AIIMAS in New Delhi, which has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with NLU Tripura to work together in promoting mediation for the benefit of the general populace.

In accepting this honor, Prof. Nachiketa Mittal, Registrar of NLU Tripura and Head of the ADR Centre, expressed his appreciation to AIIMAS for recognizing the University’s tireless initiatives in cultivating a strong ADR ecosystem. Prof. Mittal is a prominent authority and has delivered lectures on Mediation and the Indian perspective at Toledo Law School, Ohio; Miami Dade College, Florida; and Georgia State University College of Law, Atlanta. This recognition strengthens the University’s ambition to become a national frontrunner in legal education, innovation, and excellence in dispute resolution.



National Law University, Tripura, organized a Special Lecture Series on “Constitutionalism, Jurisprudence, and Contemporary Legal Challenges” from November 26–28, 2025. The lectures were delivered by Professor Krishan Mahajan, Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India, and coordinated by Dr. Jayanta Dhar along with Mr. Nehru, a Ph.D. Scholar. Across three days, LL.M. and B.A. LL.B. 5th Semester students engaged in an intensive exploration of constitutional philosophy, legal theory, judicial interpretation, and governance.

On the first day, Professor Mahajan deconstructed traditional notions of law, describing it as inherently interdisciplinary and shaped by society, politics, economics, and history. Emphasizing Article 51A(h), he underscored the importance of developing a scientific temper, humanism, and a spirit of inquiry. He also highlighted emerging technological challenges in AI, robotics, and bioengineering, while warning against intellectual stagnation.

The second day focused on constitutional interpretation, judicial creativity, and the art of reading judgments. Discussions covered Article 253, landmark judicial law-making such as the Vishaka Guidelines and the evolution of the POSH Act, and Article 32 as the heart of the Constitution. Professor Mahajan stressed the need to interpret statutes holistically, supported by a balanced understanding of socialism within welfare states.

On the final day, Professor Mahajan conceptualized the Constitution as a document of power and governance. He explained Articles 245, 246, and 73 in relation to legislative and executive authority, clarifying when executive action suffices and when parliamentary law is necessary. He further illustrated the functioning of government through Article 77(3) and the Allocation of Business Rules, emphasizing that much of India’s governance operates through executive policies, with the IAS playing a pivotal administrative role. He also explained the constitutional checks and balances that ensure no organ of the State exceeds its authority.

The lecture series concluded with the reaffirmation that the strength of Indian constitutional democracy rests on robust legal education and the commitment of students, teachers, and institutions to constitutional values, making the programme an intellectually enriching and profoundly insightful academic experience.



The Centre for Criminal Justice and Human Rights (CCJHR) at National Law University, Tripura, successfully conducted a one-credit course titled “Understanding the BNSS, 2023: From Crime Reporting to Cognizance” from November 27–29, 2025.

Designed to equip law students with a thorough understanding of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023—India’s transformative new criminal procedure legislation—the course focused on the complete trajectory of the criminal process, from the initial reporting of a crime to the stage of judicial cognizance. This structure enabled students to connect doctrinal principles with real-world application, strengthening both conceptual clarity and procedural awareness.

The sessions were led by Dr. Neeraj Tiwari, Associate Professor of Law at National Law University, Delhi, a respected scholar renowned for his work on criminal law and procedural justice. His insightful explanations, practical illustrations, and engaging pedagogy significantly enriched the academic experience, making the programme a valuable learning opportunity for all participants.

Prof. (Dr.) Kavita Singh, WBNUJS took classes on Family Law I to the B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) students



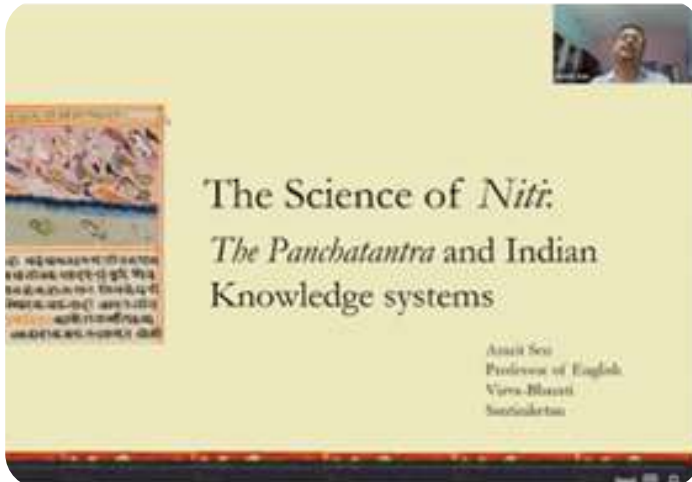

Her lectures focused on the foundational aspects of marriage and divorce, offering students both theoretical insights and practical perspectives on how these concepts are treated within Indian legal frameworks.

Through clear explanations and interactive discussions, Prof. Singh helped students understand the general principles governing matrimonial law, while also encouraging them to think critically about its social and legal implications. The classes were highly appreciated for bridging doctrinal knowledge with real-world relevance, enriching the academic journey of the budding lawyers.

Faculty Development Programme

Online FDP on “Literature as a Repository of Indian Knowledge Systems: Decolonising Narratives and the Quest for Social Justice”



National Law University, Tripura, aligned with the NEP 2020 goal of promoting Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS), successfully held a week-long Faculty Development Programme (FDP) titled “Literature as a Repository of Indian Knowledge Systems: Decolonising Narratives and the Quest for Social Justice” from August 25–30, 2025. This programme underscored the significance of Indian literature as a crucial source of indigenous knowledge systems.

The sessions centered on three main themes: the potential for decolonising literary narratives to foster inclusive and fair justice frameworks; the lasting impact of colonial ways of knowing on Indian literature and education; and the crucial role of indigenous and regional literary traditions in preserving cultural wisdom and encouraging social awareness.

During his inaugural speech, Prof. (Dr.) Yogesh Pratap Singh, Vice-Chancellor of NLU Tripura, stressed the importance of breaking down disciplinary silos within the education system. Using legal education as a reference point, he advocated for an interdisciplinary approach that incorporates Indian Knowledge Systems into law and other academic areas to enhance both teaching and research.

Throughout the FDP, attendees engaged in highly interactive and research-driven sessions led by distinguished scholars: Prof. Dinesh Kumar Nair (V.G. Vaze College, Mumbai), Prof. Prasannanshu (National Law University, Delhi), Prof. Jyotirmoy Pradhani (North-Eastern Hill University, Shillong), and Prof. Amrit Sen (Visva-Bharati University, Santiniketan).

The event saw participation from over one hundred academics and researchers from across India, including Principals, Professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors, and Ph.D. scholars. The participants hailed from a diverse range of disciplines, such as English, Law, Economics, History, and Political Science. The programme received enthusiastic feedback, showcasing its scholarly importance and practical impact.

Ms. Merelin Darlong, Assistant Professor of English at NLU Tripura, coordinated the FDP. The week-long programme concluded successfully, providing participants with valuable insights and inspiring new directions in academic research, curriculum design, and teaching methods.

Five-Day FDP on ‘Reimagining Academia: Curriculum Designing, Teaching, Evaluation, Research and Publication in the Light of NEP 2025

The MoU is intended to enhance academic engagement, reform curricula, initiate joint student projects focused on medico-legal topics, facilitate faculty and student exchanges, and encourage collaborative research efforts. This alliance aims to create connections between legal education and healthcare studies, fostering a better comprehension of medico-legal issues and their impact on society.

During the event, NLUT's Vice-Chancellor, Prof. (Dr.) Yogesh Pratap Singh, highlighted that this collaboration will offer students from both institutions a chance to participate in innovative research, hands-on learning experiences, and knowledge-sharing opportunities, preparing them to tackle new challenges in healthcare law, bioethics, and medical jurisprudence. The Principal of TIPS expressed hope that the MoU would enhance paramedical education by integrating legal knowledge, thus bolstering the professional skills of healthcare practitioners.



MoU with AIIMS, New Delhi

On September 11, 2025, the Alternative Dispute Resolution Research Centre at National Law University, Tripura, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Association for India International Mediation and Arbitration Services (AIIMAS).

This partnership aims to enhance joint research, improve mediation practices, and develop training and educational programs that align with national and international standards. Together, they seek to promote effective conflict resolution mechanisms in India and abroad.



Workshops and Seminars

NLU Tripura Hosted National Conference “From Vulnerability to Justice: Tackling Human Trafficking in Northeast India”



The Centre for Women and Child Rights, in collaboration with the Kautilya Centre for Law and Economics at National Law University, Tripura, and the Directorate of Social Welfare and Social Education, Government of Tripura, organized a national conference titled “From Vulnerability to Justice: Tackling Human Trafficking in Northeast India” on August 09, 2025.

The inaugural session was graced by Shri Tinku Roy, Hon’ble Minister of Social Welfare and Social Education, Government of Tripura, who discussed the complex border dynamics with neighbouring countries that make Northeast India a vulnerable trafficking corridor. He noted the establishment of a specialized anti-human trafficking team to address the issue in rural Tripura. Hon’ble Mr. Justice Arindam Lodh, Chairperson of the Tripura State Human Rights Commission, emphasized the urgent need for stronger policies and reinforced border management, highlighting the intersection of law, governance, and human rights. Smt. Jharna Debbarma, Chairperson of the Tripura Commission for Women, stressed the importance of awareness among women and children in villages. The session was also attended by Mr. Tapan Kumar Das, Director of the Directorate of Social Welfare and Social Education.

In his address, Prof. (Dr.) Yogesh Pratap Singh, Vice-Chancellor of National Law University, Tripura, expressed concern over trafficking in light of Tripura’s proximity to Bangladesh and underscored the role of education and policy in combating the menace. The conference featured forty-five research papers from across India on diverse aspects of trafficking and concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Debasree Debnath, Director of the Centre for Women and Child Rights.

Seminar on “Access to Justice and Universal Women Helpline in the Northeast”

The Legal Aid Society of NLU Tripura, in partnership with the Society for Fast Justice Tripura, hosted a seminar on August 13, 2025, which focused on “Access to Justice and the Universal Women Helpline in the Northeast,” emphasizing the significance of accessible legal aid and the safety of women.





The University conducted a one-week workshop titled “Unlocking the Civil Procedure Code: A Practitioner’s Perspective” from August 18–23, 2025. The aim of the workshop was to offer students an in-depth and practice-focused insight into the procedural elements of the Civil Procedure Code (CPC), 1908, with specific attention to the key stages of a civil suit and the practical application of various provisions.

The workshop started on August 18, 2025, with a formal welcome extended to Dr. Praveen Tripathi, Registrar and Associate Professor at Dharmashastra National Law University, Jabalpur, by Dr. Jayanta Dhar, Assistant Professor, and Mr. Nehru, a full-time Ph.D. scholar at NLUT. The opening session provided an introduction to the Code of Civil Procedure and outlined the fundamental stages of a civil suit, establishing a foundation for the subsequent days of intensive education.

On August 18 and 19, the sessions concentrated on the impact of parallel proceedings and the prohibition of subsequent suits as stated in Sections 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, and 44A of the CPC, alongside Orders 6, 7, and 8 that relate to pleadings.

On August 20, the sessions addressed the initial hearing and the framing of issues according to Order 14, as well as special suits that encompass set-offs, counterclaims, and interpleader suits under Section 88 read with Order 35. The discussions clarified the subtleties of these provisions and their significance in civil litigation. The session on August 21 was dedicated to supplemental proceedings as outlined in Sections 94 and 95, discussing arrest and attachment as per Order 38, temporary injunctions under Order 39, and the appointment of a receiver under Order 40. These discussions emphasized the role of interim measures in safeguarding the interests of litigants during the course of suits.

On August 22 and 23, the emphasis shifted toward the execution of decrees under Sections 36–74 in conjunction with Order 21. This covered a variety of topics, such as the definition and scope of execution, the jurisdiction of executing courts, parties involved in execution proceedings, limitations, issues to be resolved by the executing court, execution applications, methods and processes of execution, and the impact of procedural defects. The in-depth discussions enabled participants to understand the procedural intricacies involved in executing decrees effectively.

The workshop concluded on August 23, 2025, with Prof. (Dr.) Nachiketa Mittal, Registrar of NLUT, presenting a token of appreciation to Dr. Praveen Tripathi. The entire week-long event was adeptly organized by Dr. Jayanta Dhar, Assistant Professor, and Mr. Nehru, a full-time Ph.D. scholar, who ensured the smooth execution of the sessions. The workshop turned out to be a profoundly enriching academic endeavor, providing students with essential insights into the Code of Civil Procedure from a practitioner’s viewpoint.



The Public Relations and Media Committee (PRMC) at NLU Tripura, under the esteemed guidance of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Yogesh Pratap Singh, organized a Cyber Awareness Programme entitled “Think Before You Click: Building a Safer Digital World” on September 13, 2025. The session commenced with an address from the Vice-Chancellor, who shared pertinent real-life examples and incidents of cyber fraud, effectively establishing the programme's significance. Following his address, Shri Nirbesh Deb, Assistant Superintendent of Police (Cyber Crime) from the Tripura Police Crime Branch, conducted an informative session, detailing the various platforms associated with cybercrime and fraud.

He also offered invaluable guidance on preventive measures and safety practices to help individuals avoid falling victim to such threats. The event was characterized by active engagement from the Registrar, faculty members, staff, and students across all academic levels, contributing to a highly interactive and enlightening session.

National Workshop on “Access to Medicine”

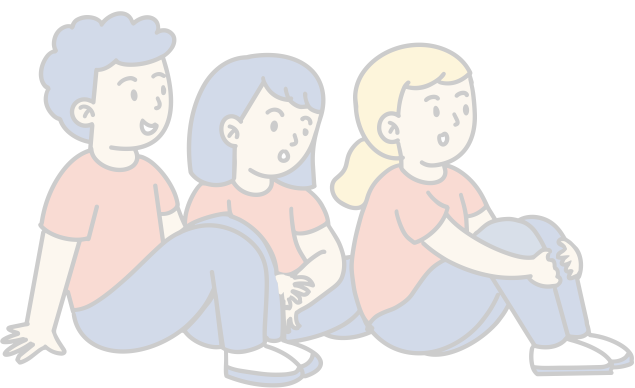

National Law University, Tripura, marked the 75th Constitution Day by hosting a National Symposium on “Press, People and the Constitution: Reimagining Freedom and Accountability” on November 26, 2025. The event brought together eminent jurists, journalists, academicians, and students to deliberate on the evolving role of the media in a constitutional democracy.

The programme opened with a welcome address by Prof. (Dr.) Yogesh Pratap Singh, Founding Vice-Chancellor of NLU Tripura. He underlined the critical role of a free yet accountable press in strengthening democratic institutions and fostering meaningful civic engagement.

Hon’ble Mr. Justice Arindam Lodh, Chairperson of the Tripura State Human Rights Commission and Former Judge of the High Court of Tripura, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. He emphasized that constitutional morality—though unwritten—is anchored in the Preamble and must guide the conduct of journalists and institutions. He reaffirmed that “a free and responsible press is essential for democracy to survive and flourish.”

Delivering the Guest of Honour address, Prof. (Dr.) Krishan Mahajan, Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India, and Former Dean of NLUO and RGNUL, highlighted the urgency of responsible digital engagement. He cautioned against the growing threat of misinformation and stressed that preserving democratic values requires both freedom of expression and mindful navigation of digital spaces.

Veteran journalist Shri Subir Bhaumik, BBC Bureau Chief for East and Northeast India, offered an incisive assessment of the current state of journalism. Calling the profession a “constant struggle for balance,” he underscored the need to listen to diverse voices. He noted that the relentless 24×7 news cycle and social media ecosystem have compromised factual accuracy, recalling Mark Tully’s reminder: “It’s important to be first, but more important to get it right.”

A Press Felicitation Ceremony was held to honour national and regional media organisations for their dedicated service as the Fourth Pillar of Democracy. The symposium witnessed enthusiastic participation from the press fraternity of Tripura, faculty and students of various law schools, and the NLU Tripura community. The programme concluded with a vote of thanks by Ms. Merelin Darlong, Faculty Advisor, Public Relations and Media, NLU Tripura, expressing gratitude to all contributors and participants for making the event a meaningful success.
